

GEORGE WASHINGTON SPEAKING INITIATIVE

In a huge leap forward we grew our speaking initiative by 77% this past academic year (Fall 2022-Spring 2023).

Constituting America delivered a record-setting 392 speeches in over 100 schools in 10 states, engaging and informing 13,257 students.

Constituting America is the only Constitution Education organization in public, private/ parochial, and home school classrooms almost daily. Over half of our school presentations are given in Title I schools. We seek to educate, inspire, and engage our audiences with our two speech options "The Relevancy of the Constitution" and "How To Have A Civil **Civic Conversation**" which are available **in** person or through video conference. In 2022 alone, we made 156 remote, live, ondemand, and pre-scheduled presentations to over **5,820** students, teachers, and adults across **40** schools in eight states.

The Constitution

Many schools teach their students how the government works, but not about how they can get involved, or how the government is accountable to "we the people." In the "Relevancy of the Constitution" speech, Constituting America teaches students foundational Constitutional principles and how to use their First Amendment rights to find and contact their representatives and write a petition to address issues about which they are passionate.

To measure our impact, we offer students a pre and post-test about the Constitution. On average our Constitution presentation raises students' scores from a D to an A, with students who participate in our program progressing from answering six out of ten questions correctly on the pretest to answering nine out of ten correctly on the post test.

Before our presentations, only 47% of students could correctly identify the Constitution as "the supreme law of the land for everyone." (23% thought it was a document that could be interpreted in any way to further a political agenda!) After our presentations, 89% of students could identify the Constitution correctly. Less than half of students could correctly identify our form of government as a republic before our presentations; but 95% could after. On the pretest, fewer than half of students knew the name for the process of changing something about the Constitution; after our presentations, nearly 90% of students defined "amending the Constitution" correctly!

Civil Civic Conversations



and divisive issues with their peers and fellow citizens productively and civilly. Through our Civil Civic process, students discover how to be an active part of the political future of our country, exercising their First Amendment rights, protected by the U.S. Constitution.

After our presentations, 91% of students said they were more open to learning about and listening to a viewpoint that differs from their own. 89% said they felt better prepared to discuss controversial issues with friends. Over half of the students said that they plan to change the way they consume news stories.









GEORGE WASHINGTON SPEAKING INITIATIVE CONTINUED

After our presentation, a 4th Grade teacher from Castle Rock, Colorado said, **"Constituting America made the Constitution and our subsequent rights 'real' for my students.** The examples provided by our facilitator illustrated these principles in a manner meaningful to the world of a 4th grader. My students went home excited to 'teach' their parents."

Since 2013, we have delivered 806 school presentations in 29 states, reaching over 52,000 student, teacher, and adult attendees.





Our previous guests have included professors, lawyers, journalists, members of Congress, and more!

Our We the Future Contest provides creative outlets for students of all ages, elementary school through college, to use their passion - whether it is creating songs, short films, public service announcements (PSA), essays, STEM projects, speeches, artwork, or **poems** – to express themselves about the U.S. Constitution. Our contest prompts push students to think about the Constitution as it relates to their own individual lives, and how the protections and framework set forth by the Constitution are a vital part of every American's day-to-day life. Creating contest entries provides students with engaging "athome" learning opportunities.

Along with winning a scholarship, our winners' works are promoted and given national exposure. Winners also receive an allexpenses-paid Mentor Trip to a major city. In addition to the student categories, we annually award the Best Constitution Lesson Plan to a teacher. Getting teachers involved in providing improved civic learning to our country's youth is a critical piece of Constituting America's mission.

In June 2022 we hosted our biggest ever mentor trip in Washington D.C.! We invited the past 3 years of our scholarship contest winners to explore the nation's capital with us to learn more about our country's founding documents and receive personal mentorship experiences from experts in fields corresponding to our contest categories.

In 2022, we sponsored our biggest mentor trip to date. We hosted a 2.5 day trip to Washington D.C. for 39 student winners from 15 states.





In 2022, Constituting America promoted Colt Jaxon's winning song "1A" on radio stations across the country. Jaxon wrote "1A" to express his love and appreciation for the first amendment of the U.S. Constitution. Jaxon's song reached the Top 5 Most Streamed songs on PLAY MPE alongside artists like Blake Shelton, Amy Sheppard, and Shane Profitt. With our promotional help, "1A" received 6 million impressions on over **30 radio stations!**

Our students' contest-winning PSAs reached 119 million TV households across the nation and garnered over 50 million Nielsen-verified radio impressions on **20 major radio stations** across the nation.

In 2022, our We the Future contest winners' PSAs, Short Films, and Music Videos received 12 film festival acceptances from film festivals all across the nation.

Colt Jaxon's 1A Music Video won Best Music Video in three separate film festivals. Adam Zheng's "Pizzas and Civil Civic Conversations" PSA won a variety of awards from Best Director at the South Florida International Film Festival to Best Micro-Short Film at the Washington D.C. International Cinema Festival.

After his mentor trip Adam told us, "I am blown away by the opportunities Constituting America has provided me, from awarding a \$1,000 scholarship to going on an unforgettable trip and promoting my PSA in households across the nation. Social Media & Advertising

We put effort into promoting our winners' works, podcasts and constitutional messaging across various social media platforms. Our ever-growing social media network has helped us gain a significant following on Facebook and become one of the largest Constitution Education organizations on YouTube. In fact, we're one of the few organizations actively using Snapchat.

As of 2022, our social media presence has expanded to **120,000 followers** on various platforms such as Facebook, YouTube, Instagram, Twitter, and Snapchat. Over the past few years, we've gained over 7,000 followers on Instagram alone and 2,700 subscribers on YouTube in 2022 alone.

Our Instagram reels and YouTube shorts have become increasingly popular, garnering a total of **765,000 views** and growing daily. To build on this success, we've introduced a new "We The Future" contest category called Social Media Video. This category encourages high school and college students to submit a 60-second video showcasing how the first amendment rights can be used to effect change in the country or explaining why civil civic conversations are essential in our society today.








American Exceptionalism Revealed: The Historic Rise and Fall of Worldwide Regimes and How Founding Wisdom Prevails

In early 2022, we launched our 12th annual 90-Day Study "American Exceptionalism Revealed: The Historic Rise & Fall of Worldwide Regimes and How Founding Wisdom Prevails." This study traces a comprehensive history and analysis of the various experiments in government that humans have tried over the past three millennia. Where other curricula might merely touch on this information, our American Exceptionalism 90-Day Study leads students to deeply examine the thought processes of the Framers as they considered questions like the nature of man, the role of virtue, and the limits of governmental power.

Since 2010, we have published over 1,336 essays by 207 guest constitutional scholars. "90 + 90 = 180. History Holds the Key to the Future"

In 2022, we published **90 essays** from **22** nationally-known Constitutional scholars, historians, and elected officials! When surveyed, 97% of our study participants learned something new about the Constitution and our country's founding principles. Since 2010, we have published over 1,336 essays by 207 guest constitutional scholar essayists. This resource is archived and searchable on our website.







LOOKING FORWARD

Since 2013, we have delivered 806 school presentations in 29 states. By the end of the 2025 school year, we will have fully built out programs in 25 states.

Over the past year, Constituting America has been focusing on several high-value target states with opportunities to deeply penetrate the local school systems and establish ourselves as a curriculum provider of choice. Buoyed by that success, and a generous leadership gift from the Diana Davis Spencer Foundation, we are seeking significant philanthropic investment for a three-phase nationwide scaling of our proven model.

Phase One (2023-24 School Year):


Based on current operating resources, for the 2023-2024 school year, we will focus our efforts in twelve states- Colorado, Utah, Oklahoma, and Texas, where our build out has already begun, and Maryland, Pennsylvania, Florida, Georgia, Virginia, South Carolina, Ohio, and Washington, **D.C.**, where we are poised to begin the same level of outreach and investment.

These states were chosen to leverage relationships with schools, funders, and potential speakers. We are proud to have received dedicated funding from the Diana Davis Spencer Foundation for this expansion, as well as the Daniels Fund and the Anscutz Foundation for our efforts in Colorado, the Sorenson Legacy Foundation to fund our work in Utah, the Hatton W. Sumners Foundation for our Oklahoma work, and the Wayne Duddlesten Foundation to make our efforts in Houston and Texas possible.

Phase Two (2024-25 School Year):

In phase two of our national build out, Constituting America will target areas of greatest need in the battlefield of ideas. We will maintain efforts in our Phase One states, with a goal of adding three additional states. Possible targets include Arizona and Tennessee, where all students pass a civics

test before graduating from high school (with Tennessee students required to pass the United States citizenship and immigration test); Illinois, Michigan and Indiana.

Phase Three (2025-26 School Year):

In phase three we will maintain and expand target states from years one and two, from among the following possible targets:



Louisiana, Maine, Michigan, Minnesota, North Carolina, Wisconsin, Nevada and New Mexico. By the end of year three-in time for the start of the landmark 250th birthday celebrations of the Declaration of Independence-Constituting America will have full-scale operations in nearly half the states.
