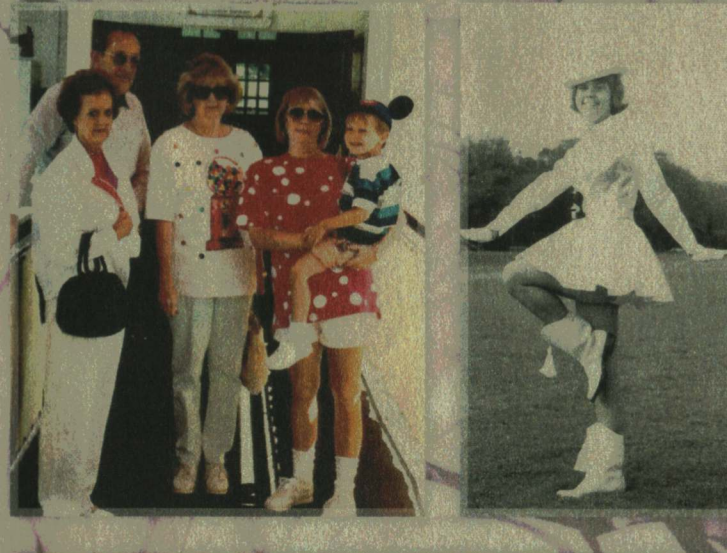


Marilyn was born on July 31, 1950, in Dallas, Texas, to Bobbie Jean and William Charles Buchanan.

Marilyn became Pat's personal assistant and worked for him and Cheri until Pat's untimely death in 2013. Afterwards, Marilyn continued to help Cheri. In 2012, she began to help Janine, her daughter, Juliette, and Cathy Gillespie with their nonprofit organization "Constituting America," whose mission is to educate and inform America's adults and primarily high school students about the importance of the U.S. Constitution and the foundation it sets forth regarding our freedoms and rights.
